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## **Cataract Surgery Eye Drop Options/Instructions**

We offer two post-operative medication options for your cataract surgery. We understand drops are both burdensome to use and can become costly, therefore our goal is to provide you with the most cost-effective option tailored for you.

Option 1: Less Drops / Compounded eye drops from ImprimisRx Pharmacy	
<u>Pred-Moxi-Brom (Steroidal, Antibiotic &amp; Non-steroidal Anti-Inflammatory)</u> - Purchased from Medical Center Eye Clinic. <b>Start 1 day</b> prior to surgery. Use 1 drop in surgical eye 4 times per day for <b>1 week after surgery</b> .	
<u>Pred-Brom (steroid and non-steroidal anti-inflammatory)</u> - Purchase from Medical Center Eye Clinic. <b>Tapered</b> schedule starting on post-operative day 8: Use 1 drop two times per day for 2 weeks then once per day for 3 weeks.	
*The cost for this option is \$70 for Pred-Moxi-Brom & \$60 for Pred-Brom payable to the clinic. May have to purchase a second bottle of Pred-Brom for 2nd eye.	
Option 2: Traditional drops picked up from the pharmacy.	
All drops are started 1 day before surgery!	
Ofloxacin (antibiotic) - Use 1 drop in surgical eye four times per day for 7 days after surgery.	
Prolensa (Non-Steroidal Anti-Inflammatory) - Use 1 drop in surgical eye 1 time a day for 4-6 weeks.	
Lotemax SM (Steroidal Anti-Inflammatory) – Tapered schedule: Use 1 drop in surgical eye three times per day for 1 week, then two times per day for 2 weeks, then one time per day for 3 weeks.	
*The cost will vary based on insurance coverage. Many of our patients have reported these drops cost in excess of \$400 without coupons. Coupons are an option to bring down the cost but still can be costly since they are branded medications.
